

WHITSTABLE YACHT CLUB Tasar National Championships June 13-15 2025 SAILING INSTRUCTIONS



1 RULES AND ELIGIBILITY

- 1.1 The event will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing 2025 2029, the prescriptions of the RYA, the rules of the Tasar Class Association, Canterbury City Council Water Safety Rules and these Sailing Instructions. In cases of conflict, these Sailing Instructions will prevail.
- 1.2 Advertising will be allowed in accordance with the rules of the Tasar Class Association.
- 1.3 Insurance cover: each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of £3,000,000 per incident or the equivalent

2 MEASUREMENT

2.1 Boats must have current measurement certificates and buoyancy endorsements as required by the class rules. Protests and disputes on measurement or other class rules will be referred to the class association and results will be announced "subject to protest".

3 SAFETY

- 3.1 Personal responsibility: Neither the provision of support boats and crews nor the decision of a Race Officer to start or continue a race shall absolve a boat of the personal responsibilities defined in RRS Fundamental Rules 1 and 3
- 3.2 Personal buoyancy: Personal Floatation Devices (PFD) must be worn by competitors at all times when afloat. Wet suits and dry suits are not personal buoyancy and will not satisfy this instruction Flag Y will not be displayed. This alters RRS 40.
- 3.3 Shipping: Boats shall always keep well clear of shipping wherever it may be.
- 3.4 Tallies: A tally system shall be in use where a tally number will be allocated to each boat at registration. All competitors shall tally out of the box provided before launching and shall tally back in the appropriate box immediately after coming ashore, and certainly WITHIN 30 MINUTES OF THE FINISH OF THE LAST BOAT IN THE LAST RACE OF THE DAY.

Failure to comply with this sailing instruction may be disqualification or a contribution of £10 to the RNLI made before the end of the protest time, as provided for in Rule 64.

4 COMMUNICATIONS WITH COMPETITORS

- 4.1 **Notice to Competitors:** Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board in the Sea Room.
- 4.2 **Changes in Sailing Instructions:** Any changes in the Sailing Instructions will be posted 1 hour before the advertised starting time of the race concerned, except for a change to the starting time of the first race of the following day, which will be posted by 20.00 on the day before it will take effect. Changes in Sailing Instructions will be indicated by Flag "L" flown from the WYC flagstaff until such time as deemed reasonable.
- 4.3 Competitors must NOT go afloat until the 'D' flag is flown from the club mast. The warning signal will not be made less than 45 minutes after flag D is displayed'.
- 4.4 **Briefing.** There will be a briefing for competitors on Friday June 13 at 11.00.

5 PROGRAMME

5.1 Friday June 13: HW 14.54

First Warning Signal will be no earlier than 12.55

Two or three races will follow back to back.

Saturday June 14: HW 15.32

First Warning Signal will be no earlier than 11.55

Two or three races will follow back to back.

Sunday June 15: HW 16.10

First Warning Signal will be no earlier than 11.55

Two or three races will follow back to back.

No warning signal shall be made after 16.00.

6 CLASS WARNING SIGNAL

6.1 The class warning signal will be: International Code Flag T/Tasar flag.

7 COURSE INSTRUCTIONS

- 7.1 **Course:** The course will be similar to a traditional Olympic triangle / sausage course, but with a fixed Start and Finish line a short distance to windward of the leeward mark to facilitate quick starts for back-to-back races. The course configuration and order of rounding marks is shown on the attached diagram.
- 7.2 The number of laps for each race will normally be 3. Any variation to this will be shown on the Committee Boat before the Warning signal.
- 7.3 **Magnetic bearing of Mark 1:** The approximate magnetic bearing of Mark 1 from the committee boat may be displayed on the committee boat before the warning signal.
- 7.4 **Description of course marks:** Course marks will be orange inflatable buoys; a new mark used in the event of a course change will be a large inflatable black ball See SI: 9 (Change of course after the start). The starting marks and finishing marks will

be a race committee boat or an Inner Distance Mark (IDM) at the Starboard end and a black spherical buoy at the port end.

8 STARTS

- 8.1 **Starting Procedures:** will be in accordance with Rule 26 with warning signal 5 minutes before the start. The race officer may alert competitors that he is about to make the warning signal by sounding a number of short blasts.
 - 8.1.1 The Committee Boat: will take station to leeward of Mark 1 and display an orange flag during the starting sequence.
 - 8.1.2 Start Line: is defined as the line between the mast displaying an orange flag on the committee boat, and the centre of the port end starting mark which is a black cylindrical buoy. The committee boat at the starting line may hold station using engines.
 - 8.1.3 An Inner Distance Mark (IDM): may be laid to mark the starboard end of the line. The IDM may not be on the line. When an IDM is laid boats must start between the IDM and the port end starting mark. The IDM will be described at the briefing.
- 8.2 A boat shall not start later than 5 minutes after her starting signal.

9 CHANGE OF COURSE AFTER THE START

- 9.1 After the start, should the course be changed, a new mark (a black inflatable ball) will be used. Any change of course will be signaled before the leading boat has begun the leg to the new mark, although the new mark may not then be in position. The new mark will be in position before the leading boat is adversely affected. The original mark will be lifted as soon as is practicable.
- 9.2 To signal a change of course, a race committee vessel near the mark preceding the new mark will display a red or green flag to indicate whether the new compass bearing is to port or starboard respectively of its previous bearing and will make repetitive sound signals. Any mark to be rounded after the new mark may be re-located, without additional signals, in order to maintain the original course configuration.
- 9.3 When, in any subsequent change of course, a new mark is replaced, it will be replaced with an original mark. SI: 9 alters Rule 33.

10 FINISHING

10.1 **Finishing Line**: The finishing line will be between the mast displaying a blue flag, aboard a committee boat and the finishing mark, which will be a black spherical buoy or, for a shortened course, the nearby course mark. The committee boat at the finishing line may hold station using engines.

10.2 Time Limit:

10.2.1 The time limit and target time in minutes is as follows:

Time	Target	Finishing
Iimit	time	window
60	40	20

- 10.2.2 The Finishing Window is the time for boats to finish after the first boat sails the course and finishes. Boats failing to finish within the Finishing Window, will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS 35, A5.1 and A5.2.
- 10.2.3 Failure to meet the Target Time will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1(a).
- 10.2.4 The race committee may award a finishing place to a boat by flying flag W with a sound signal. The signalled boat shall be deemed to have finished, and the score awarded shall be the position she occupied at the time of the signal. If two or more overlapped boats are signalled, they shall be scored as if they were tied. This changes RRS 28.1 and A3.

11 PROTESTS

- 11.1 A protesting boat shall inform the race committee on the committee boat as soon as possible after finishing, but without interfering with other boats finishing.
- 11.2 **Protest time limit:** The protest time limit will end 1 hour after the last boat has finished the last race of the day, unless the protest or race committee extend this time limit.

12 SCORING

The low point system of appendix A (Scoring) will apply.


If four races are held, there will be one discard; if one - three races are held, all will count.

A) Triangle/sausage



START: CB - B line

LAP 1: 1P, 2P, 3P, CB-B gate


LAP 2: 1P, BP (or CBS), 3P, CB-B gate

LAP 3; as LAP 1

Please note the requirement in the course description for competitors to pass through the START/FINISH gate on ALL windward legs.

Also note the requirement in the course description for competitors NOT to pass through the START/FINISH gate on the run – boats may either round B to port or CB to Starboard

B) Windward/Leeward



START : CB – B line ALL LAPS: 1P, 2P, CB-B gate
